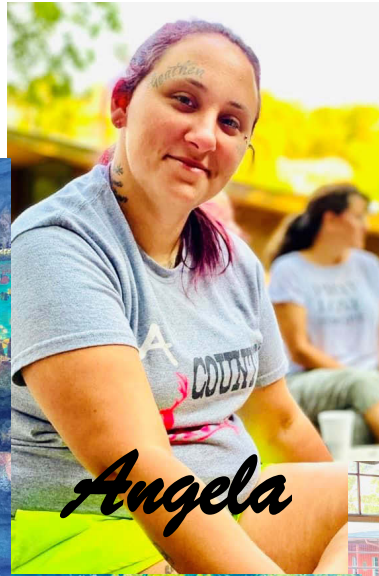


From Mugshots to Beauty Shots

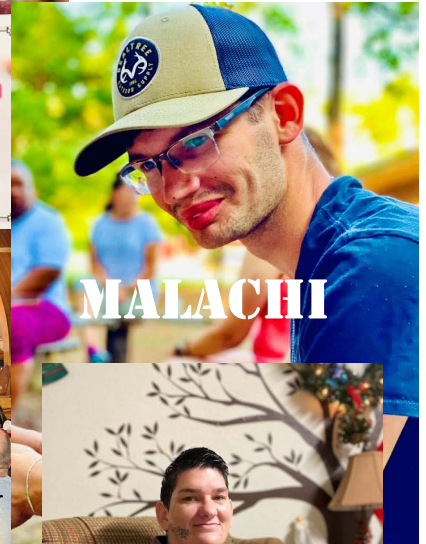

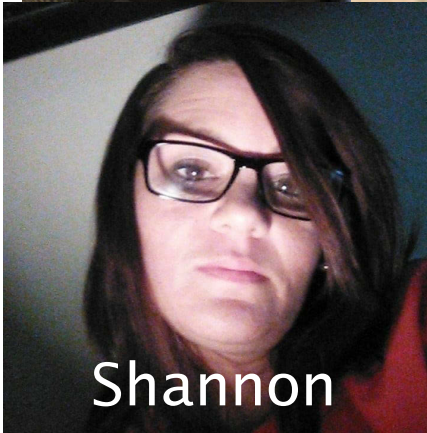

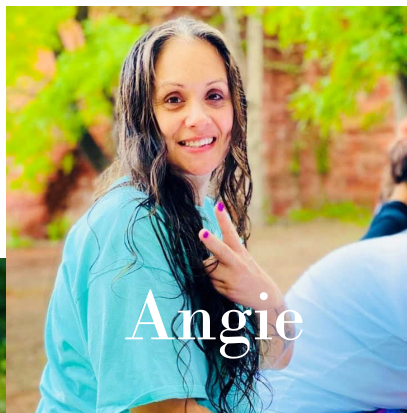

Here's some photos of our most recent Exodus House clients. Red and yellow, black and white, aren't they all precious and ious and beautiful?

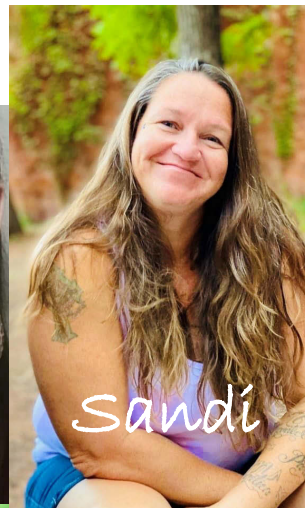

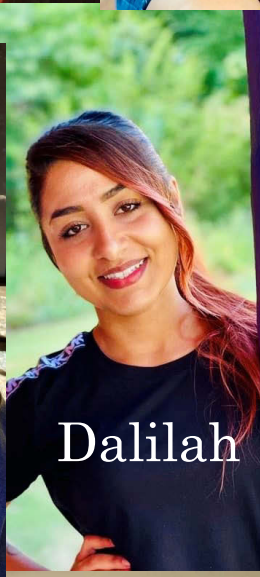

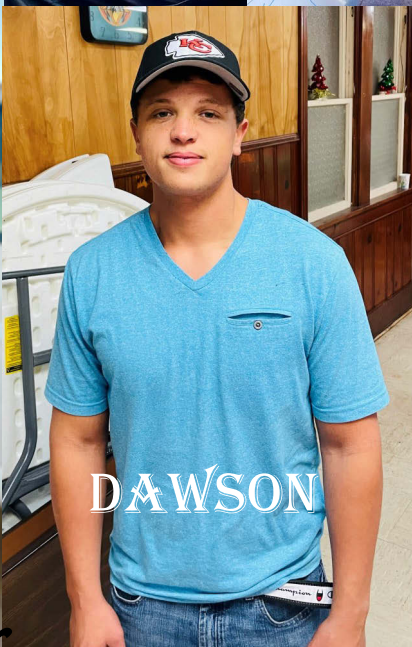
